Report Cards

As indicated in communications this year there have been some changes made to report cards: **Report Cards**

The Ministry of Education is modifying the way teachers report student progress to parents. They are moving from "reporting to parents" to "communicating with parents on an ongoing basis".

What will this look like for your family?

The traditional Report Card has been replaced with a Mid-Year Snapshot of Student Progress (February), and a Summative Report (June). Whereas the traditional Report Cards were distributed at the end of each term, the new written reports will be sent home on February 10th and June 29th.

The written reports will look different. New are the Descriptive Feedback and the Student Performance Scale sections. Letter grades will not be included on either written report.

Teachers will be following a new format for Ongoing Communication with parents, which must include four criteria: Authentic Evidence (student work), the Learning Standards of the BC Curriculum, Descriptive Feedback from the teacher to the student, and Student Voice (the student's self-assessment).

How will educators communicate with parents? There is no one prescribed format. Some teachers may choose to use a digital portfolio, some may choose to use email, some may choose to use paper based methods, and some may choose to use a combination of methods.

School Closures Due to Weather

Occasionally, schools are temporarily closed on short notice for emergency reasons. A heavy

snowfall is the most frequent reason for emergency school closure; however, individual schools can also be closed because of power or heating failures.



If schools are closed due to snow, or any other weather-related problems, announcements will be on local radio stations (WOLF 106.9 FM and WAVE 102.3 FM) by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure. Please do not call the radio station – tune in and listen for the announcements, which will be made on a regular basis.

The district will post the information on the district's website, Twitter and Facebook, unless there are technical problems or a power outage.

Kindergarten and Other Registration SCHOOL REGISTRATION 2017-2018

A new, convenient and streamlined process to register your child in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools will begin on **January 11**, 2017.

The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. If your answer is yes to any of the following questions, you will register through the new online registration process:

Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?

Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2017? (ie new Kindergarten in September)

Do I want to register my child in French Immersion?

Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?

Do I want to register my child at Departure Bay Eco- School?

Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz)

Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)?

Before you begin, you will need the following:

1) A valid email address

2) Photo or scan showing proof of citizenship (ie. Birth certificate)

3) Photo or scan showing proof of Canadian residency (ie. Mortgage or bank statement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

Online registration will begin on Wednesday, January 11, 2017 at 8 a.m. Pacific Standard Time.

Early and Late French Immersion, and Departure Bay Eco-school students will have until January 31, 2017 to register online. Student selection will once again be determined by lottery, with parents being notified by Friday, February 3, 2017.

New Academy, Out-of-Catchment and Out of District student registrations will be prioritized by date and time submitted online. Deadline is March 31, 2017.
