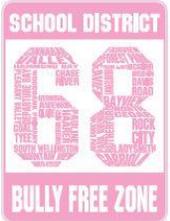

Coding at Rock City Elementary

What? Programmers write scripts of code to make a computer or piece of technology perform a task. Every piece of technology you use everyday was programmed through scripts of code to perform for you, including your car, phone, microwave, t.v., even your refrigerator, heat and cooling systems, not to mention the technology used to create your clothing, furniture, flooring, lighting and even your food.

Why do we teach this? Computer Science is the fastest growing employment sector in the world.

We will have a serious shortage of people able to program and run the world of technology if we do not help prepare our students now. We used to prepare our students to work in various industries. Programming is the industry we now need to prepare our students for. "The Next Big Blue-Collar Job is Coding" (Thompson, 02/08/17 in Wired, <https://www.wired.com/2017/02/programming-is-the-new-blue-collar-job/>)

How? Code is a computer language and there are many different coding languages. At Rock City we teach the basics of coding which uses many skills such as computational, critical and creative thinking. Coding is about identifying a problem or situation and determining how to solve it. We do this through a "play-based" environment. So rather than teaching step-by-step, students learn the basics, play and then jump in to create programs. We use both tech and non-tech approaches to teaching coding. The technology we use is Scratch developed by MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) which is accessed via the computer, various Apps for the iPads and iPods and simple robots called Spheros. All students K-7 can learn to Code using these tools.

When? Four of our classes participated in Coding Quest through the Learning Partnership, all our intermediate students have been working with Code using Scratch and the Spheros during their "Tech" blocks in the library, many of the primary classes are using the iPads to Code with apps such as Kodable, Scratch jr. and Osmo and many students come to our Coding Club twice a week for further Coding exploration.
