### New Reporting Interim Order

Our provincial curriculum is designed to engage the passions and interests of our students to better meet their personalized needs. With these changes, quality assessment and reporting practices takes on increased significance. Reporting refers to the sharing of student progress to parents/guardians.

This year, we will continue to **communicate student learning with parents/guardians on an ongoing basis**. ### Halloween Safety



On Tuesday, October 31<sup>st</sup> we are having a costume parade for all students at 8:50 am. **We ask that costumes be free of masks, blood or weapons (swords, guns, etc.)** As we are a Healthy School and follow the BC Healthy School Guidelines, we request that students bring **No Halloween Candy to school**, especially for recess and lunch snacks. We ask parents to please monitor this before your child leaves home each day. Thank you for your assistance.

#### *Halloween Safety*

1. Wear a lightly colored, flame resistant costume. Use reflective tape so car drivers can see you.
2. Make-up is better than a mask. A mask with small holes for your eyes makes it hard to see.
3. Wear a short costume so you don't trip.
4. Be safe – carry a flashlight so you can see in the dark and be better seen.
5. Trick-or-Treat on one side of the street, then the other side. Never crisscross the street.
6. Go out with a parent or other responsible adult. Older children should go out in groups.
7. Discuss your route with your parents and what time to be home.
8. Never go inside a strange house, apartment, or car.
9. Have a parent check your treats before you eat any. Have a snack or meal before going out.
10. Know the Block Parent homes in your area in case you're frightened, lost, or hurt.

## Security Protocol

Ensuring safety for all students and school personnel is very important to us at Rock City Elementary.
